



CAPE TOWN ANIMAL RESCUE AND VET PROJECT

ABOUT THE PROJECT

This project is open to anyone with a love of animals and a passion for helping with their rescue, rehabilitation, treatment and care. Join our dynamic team to rescue, rehabilitate and re-home animals that are lost, abandoned, abused and neglected.

You will live in a lovely area of Cape Town, and spend your days between two different rescue shelters, each with onsite vet clinics.

- Mdzananda Animal Clinic in Khayelitsha is based in a poverty stricken township, so you can get in to the heart of the community and make a huge difference to animals in need.
- TEARS animal shelter is based in Sunnydale and can have over 300 rescued dogs on site at any given time, with a second location for cats as well.

Between the two locations, you will see an amazing variety of cases and benefit from working alongside two separate teams. Both locations serve animals from surrounding disadvantaged townships and have mobile clinics that travel out to animals in need daily. While the prime focus is the rescue of domestic animals, the shelters also rescues terrestrial birds and wild animals. The shelter is pro-life and animals are only euthanized on the advice of a veterinarian, when they are incurably ill, with no hope of recovery.

If you are a vet student, this is the perfect opportunity for you to work alongside highly qualified veterinarians and veterinary nursing staff who will be happy to share their knowledge with you. If you aren't studying animal or veterinary science, you'll still be able to assist on multitude of levels and gain some amazing work experience.









DAY TO DAY—non vets

Volunteers work 9am to 5pm (with some daily variation) Monday through to Friday, with weekends off to explore and relax. Your daily activities will be tailored to your current interests, passions and level of training.

ANIMAL LOVERS

Those with no veterinary training who are coming to make an impact as animal rescue, rehabilitation and care volunteers, you will carry out the below jobs. Also, if you are interested, you will be encouraged to shadow and learn from the vet and nurse team as well.

- Feed dogs and cats
- Grooming animals in the rescue centre
- Giving TLC to strays
- Help teach the local community about welfare and animal rights
- Walk dogs, socialise them and play with them
- Learn to do basic medical checks, like temperature and heart rate
- Help give basic medications like tablets
- Learn to help the vet/nurse team with tasks like restraining dogs and cats for injections



THOSE WITH NURSING, PRE VET, OR ANIMAL CARE EXPERIENCE

You will work closely with the shelter staff and highly qualified veterinarians and nurses, vet techs and care assistants. They will get you as involved as possible and will help equip you with the knowledge you need to contribute to the health and well-being of animals wherever your career takes you.

As well as the above tasks, you will work hands-on within the kennels and hospital to:

- Carry out routine health checks and assist with medicating patients
- Triage animals coming to the hospital
- Help with pre and post op preparation and patient care
- Help pack and sterilise surgical kits and prepare for surgery
- Develop nursing skills like anaesthetic monitoring, catheter placement, intubating, bandaging and monitoring pain in post surgical patients





DAY TO DAY—vets and students

VETS AND VET STUDENTS

Those interested in, or currently studying veterinary medicine as well as already qualified vets, will get great exposure to animal medicine in a different country. We will help you register with the South African authorities prior to your arrival and so you can assist a local veterinarian with medical work ups, diagnosis, treatments and surgeries, in line with your experience.

This can include:

- Vaccinations
- Sterilisations (spay and castrate)
- Soft tissue surgery (e.g. lump removals)
- Orthopaedic surgery
- Non surgical fracture management
- Consultations
- Wound care and closure
- Diagnostics- blood, smear and crush samples
- Dealing with tick borne diseases

You will also get a chance to travel with the mobile clinic, assisting with vaccinations and sterilizations, educating about husbandry and establishing a working relationship with the local residents.

Please note, this is a busy functioning clinic and rehoming centre where you will gain real life experience. Everyone from the receptionists to the head vet help with all aspects of animal care and 'behind the scenes' administration work. You will be required to do the same, so remember, this is not a training course, and you must be keen to help with everything, not just the medicine and surgery.









WHERE YOU STAY

PROJECT LOCATION

Cape Town is located in the country of South Africa and is officially one of the most beautiful cities in the world. Framed between oceans and mountains, it's surrounded by incredible natural beauty, with Table Mountain, one of the Seven Natural Wonders of the World, being a highlight. Cape Town is also a place of huge diversity, lively cultures, and a vibrant nightlife. Living here is dynamic and interesting, and weekends will give you a huge variety of exciting activities.

You can, for instance, venture to the top of Table Mountain, go paragliding, take to the ocean by kayak, hang out on some of the many beaches, sip wine at stunning vineyards, head out on safari, enjoy some Africa's finest restaurants and even take to the skies on a helicopter flight over the city. For those more interested in exploring South Africa's culture, how about visiting the historic Robben Island, or taking a free walking tour through the city to learn about Apartheid?







ACCOMMODATION

You will be staying in a fully-furnished house situated in Muizenberg, just 3 minutes away from the beach. This area is one of the major tourism attractions in Cape Town and a surfer's paradise. The area is filled with vibey bars, cafes, and amazing restaurants, and you'll be based just opposite a major grocery store for you to do extra shopping should you need.

The volunteer accommodation is a cozy, safe home shared by volunteers and African Impact staff. It boasts a central lounge and dining area, a living room with some comfortable couches for socializing and relaxing, preparing for your next day or chatting with fellow volunteers, as well as a spacious backyard in the sun to relax, or to enjoy a South African Braai. It is the perfect base from which to explore this incredible city. There are 10 bedrooms, each sleeping 6 or 8 people.



Local staff salaries

Volunteer fees are the main source of funding for most of our projects, so by joining us, 75% of your fee goes directly to the charities we work with (check out the 'Local staff salaries' and 'Animal care/medication' slices on the chart!). On top of this it allows us to hold thorough insurance (5%) to safeguard yourself and our staff, as well as putting funds back in to marketing (5%), so more volunteers find out about the projects, and help fund them in the future.
